President Mahama Assents to Fisheries and Aquaculture Bill. 2025.

The President of the Republic, H.E. John Dramani Mahama, has signed the Fisheries and Aquaculture Bill, 2025 into law, marking a significant advancement in Ghana's fisheries governance. The new Fisheries and Aquaculture Act, 2025 (Act 1146), establishes major reforms focused on sustainability, stronger compliance, and better livelihoods, particularly for small-scale fishers.
